OUR LAST MEETING

 Speaker: Steve Frost gave us a wonderful overview of the changes in policing in Victoria in the last 30 years. His talk covered GPS, bans on smoking & air-conditioning in police cars, booze buses, photos on licences, digital radio communication, CCTV, OC spray and foam, extendable batons, ballistic vests, computerisation & more suitable police firearms. Heidelberg has 7500 crimes annually. Monthly our local police deal with 60 collisions, 70 burglaries and 60 family violence matters. Half the problems occur in West Heidelberg but changes are afoot with gentrification in that area, plus a very strong Neighbourhood Renewal Project. The Greensborough Mall is also occasionally a problem area. Steve has 120 staff & police bureaucracy is now greatly improved. Policewomen also play a much greater role than they used to.
